Pastoral Musings

There are some times that I hit a block and can't imagine what I could possibly write about. Part of the problem is that this column is written on Tuesday – and come Sunday anything here might be old news - for example, the papal conclave.

I just finished an on-camera interview with Channel 8 news. Such interviews are not one of my favorite things. I don't feel comfortable in front of the camera and would prefer to ponder questions for a bit rather than responding off-the-cuff. Fr. Sean is gifted in that way and I think would make a better "front man." Fr. Zack has a great smile that just makes you want to go up and meet him.

During the interview, one of the questions was who did I think would be the next pope. Heck, by the time you read this, I hope we have one. For now, I have no idea. I think I would like Cardinal O'Malley, OFM. Cap. from Boston – not that I have a sense of him as a person, or how he might be as pope, but because he is someone who is Franciscan. Even as a cardinal he continues to wear his Franciscan habit. I think I would like the contrasting image of Pope "Sean" in his simple friar habit with sandals against the backdrop of all the splendor of St. Peter and the Vatican. Some people might think the goal of 100% participation is unrealistic, but I think it is (at least in part) a measure of the degree to which we as a church/parish have made the Faith a priority in daily life. It was well said by Jim Rossman, our Chair of the Stewardship Committee – we are people who are comfortable giving to a need but we need to be people who have an interior need to give. Something to think about.
