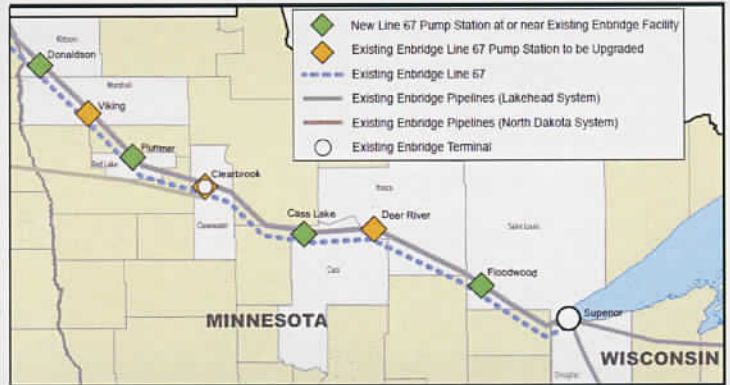

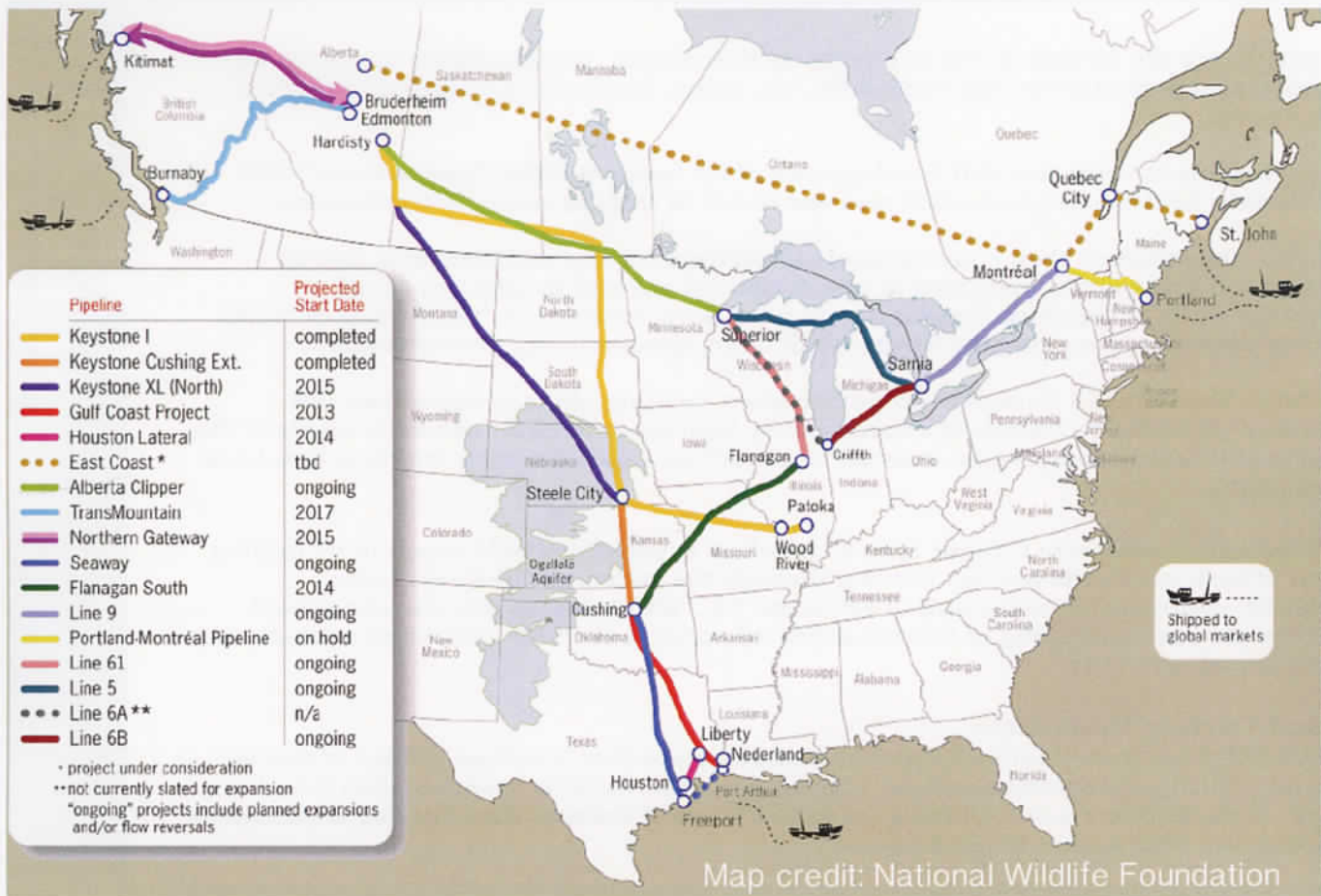

Tar sands are the dirtiest forms of energy on this planet. It jeopardizes the earth, our livelihood and puts at great risk our health, air, water, land, communities and beloved north woods.

Climate Scientists warn that full development of tar sands **will be “game over” for the climate** because its production and use result in 15-20% more CO2 emissions.

Tar sands are different than conventional oil. Extraction and production is energy intensive requiring large quantities of water, natural gas and in-situ (fracking) technology while at the same time destroying the boreal forests or “rainforests of North America” and compromising the health of all living species living downstream.


Enbridge Energy is a Canadian corporate giant pushing plans to expand an old network of pipelines to transport a dangerously high amount of tar sands throughout the Midwest and Great Lakes region in order to export tar sands to global markets (see back side of page).

In Minnesota, the Alberta Clipper Line 67 pipeline expansion would result in 37 million gallons of toxic tar sands per day flowing through the state and the Great Lakes watershed—comparable to the size of Keystone XL. Minnesotans are also concerned about the proposed shipping of this tar sands oil across Lake Superior, at an estimated 13 million barrels per year.

Beyond Carbon Emissions

In 2010, Enbridge-owned Line 6B Pipeline dumped more than 1 million gallons of raw tar sands into Michigan’s Kalamazoo River – the largest freshwater tar sands spill in U.S. history. *Communities* are still cleaning up. **Line 67 in MN crosses three major watersheds including the Mississippi River 5 times!**

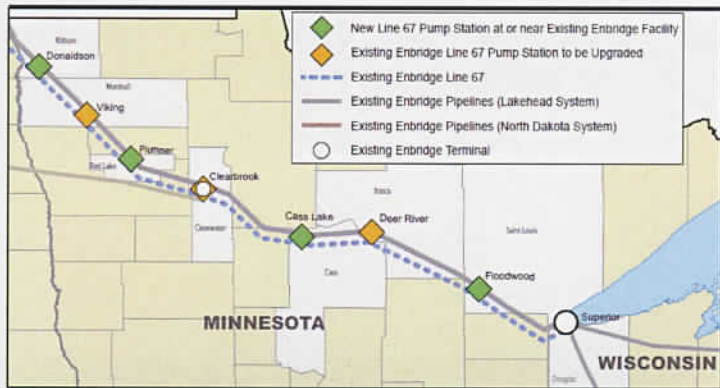
