Stanislaw Skrowaczewski, conductor

Stanislaw Skrowaczewski commands an extraordinary level of respect in the international music community as both conductor and composer. He has been on the Minnesota Orchestra's artistic staff for nearly half its 112-year history, first as music director from 1960 to 1979 and subsequently as conductor laureate. He last led the ensemble in concerts with pianist Garrick Ohlsson in May 2015.

This past summer Skrowaczewski, who has often been honored for his interpretations of Bruckner's music, returned to the Bruckner Orchestra of Linz to conduct programs at St. Florian's Basilica and other locations; a few months earlier he released a new recording of Bruckner's Third Symphony

with the London Philharmonic Orchestra. His recent and upcoming engagements include performances with the Berlin Radio Symphony, Deutsche Radio Philharmonie, Frankfurt Radio Symphony, Hallé Orchestra, Bergen Philharmonic, São Paulo Symphony Orchestra and Yomiuri Nippon Symphony, of which he is honorary conductor laureate. He is the subject of a biography by Frederick Harris, Jr., as well as two documentary films, one of which will be shown in the Target Atrium prior to each Guarantors' Week concert. Anthony Ross, cello

Anthony Ross, now in his 28th year as a Minnesota Orchestra member,

assumed the principal cello post in 1991. While here he has drawn acclaim for his solo performances of many great concertos and chamber works, including, most recently, Strauss' *Don Quixote* and Eric Whitacre's *The River Cam*.

An avid chamber musician, Ross is a member of Accordo, an ensemble composed of principal string players from the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra and Minnesota Orchestra; he also plays regularly with the Chamber Music Society of Minnesota and with ensembles of his Minnesota Orchestra colleagues. He has performed at music festivals in the U.S. and Europe and has been a faculty member at the Grand Teton, Aspen, Madeline Island and Indiana University festivals. His recordings include Bernstein's Three Meditations, made with the Minnesota Orchestra, and Carter and Rachmaninoff sonatas for Boston Records. For more information, visit minnesotaorchestra.org.
