VETERAN'S DAY NOVEMBER 11, 1994. Photo and text from Henry Bernard's daughter Florence Hedeen: "Dad had set his alarm for 11:55 p.m. November 10 and called me to help him with a project, which he'd warned about earlier in the day, without being specific about what he wanted me to do. He was waiting for me where the main hallway met his apartment's (96A) hallway. He handed me the flag pictured above, and some push pins. The flag was hung without pomp and circumstance in the main hall at midnight, Veteran's Day, remaining there until midnight the close of that day."
