

The Vietnam War defined a generation. It changed the lives of people who fought in it and who fought against it. For more than 20 years, Twin Cities PBS (TPT) has served as a trusted storyteller of the veteran experience, a history that has reached a new pinnacle through an ambitious, year-long initiative called **Minnesota Remembers Vietnam**, which invites the people who call our great state home to remember stories, recognize bravery, express their reasons for dissent, and foster understanding around the lasting impact of the war.

TPT launched **Minnesota Remembers Vietnam** to expand on the epic documentary, *The Vietnam War*, by Ken Burns and Lynn Novick. The resulting collaboration among the state's 6 public television stations features an online Story Wall, additional documentaries, and a series of public screenings and commemorative events that seek to more fully remember, honor, and understand the aftermath of the war.

The magnitude of the Vietnam War surpasses any single narrative. Only when a chorus of voices and perspectives come together can we begin to feel the true weight of its complex, haunting legacy. In this spirit, TPT breathes life into the **Minnesota Remembers Vietnam** initiative through a variety of stories that offer an intimate portrait of the way our country grapples with the traumas of war.

# THE STORY WALL



My brother, 1st Lieutenant William James Crockett (or Billy as I called him), was 9 years older than me. He was a handsome, smart, kind older brother. I adored him. When I look at the Vietnam Wall and see the 58,000-plus names on it, I understand what each name represents: a unique, person-shaped hole in the hearts of untold numbers of mothers, fathers, siblings, spouses, children, and friends.

Minnesota Remembers Vietnam: The Telling Project follows the journey of Minnesota Vietnam War and Hmong veterans and family cast to perform their personal stories in an original stage production. National performing arts non-profit The Telling Project deepens understanding of the veteran experience while serving and returning to civilian life. This one-hour program documents the cast's efforts to share their stories in a stage production through a series of interviews, in rehearsals, and ultimately in their performance with an invited audience.

Minnesota Remembers Vietnam: The Telling Project explores the vulnerability and strength of each veteran taking on this work.

The Telling Project is such a unique and powerful way of connecting veterans to their communities. In the span of just six days, this incredible group went from not knowing their lines at all to performing the script flawlessly in front of a room full of strangers. # **PERSPECTIVES**

A TWIN CITIES PBS ORIGINAL | AIRING FALL 2017

**T**PT producer Luke Heikkila is no stranger to telling stories that capture the complicated experiences of veterans. In a series of 12 short profiles, as well as a documentary about Minnesota veterans, that will extend the story of the Vietnam War across TPT.ORG and social media, Heikkila went deeper to unpack the personal narratives of people who stood on the front lines of one of the most unsettling chapters in American history. The *Perspectives* stories reveal the unexpected ways that war forever changes someone.

I was born a few months after the fall of Saigon. For me, the Vietnam War isn't a lived history, but one I learned about on the movie screen. "Full Metal Jacket," "Apocalypse Now," "Good Morning, Vietnam," and "Platoon" were films that provided me with my basis for understanding of the Vietnam War. As I began gathering information for the Minnesota Remembers Vietnam projects I was working on, I knew I would need to replace these Hollywood depictions from the minds of Hollywood directors Barry Levinson, Stanely Kubrick, and Oliver Stone with actual accounts of what it was like to go to Southeast Asia during the war, so I began to read first-hand accounts written by men and women from Minnesota. Jon Hovde, Michael Maurer, and Wendell Affield provided me, through their books, a vivid and desperate sense of Vietnam that no Hollywood director could. Through phone calls and conversations over cups of coffee I began to learn what, I felt ashamed to admit, I hadn't already known about the hundreds of thousands of people who fought and died for America.

# AMERICA'S SECRET WAR

A TWIN CITIES PBS ORIGINAL | PREMIERES OCTOBER 3 | 8PM ON TPT 2

In the shadows of the Vietnam War, the CIA organized a secret war in neighboring Laos to prevent the threat of communism from spreading deeper into Southeast Asia. The Hmong people of Laos fought for the U.S. — and for themselves — to keep Ho Chi Minh's Communist North Vietnamese regime from destroying their way of life. Until 1994, the CIA never publicly acknowledged the clandestine activities in Laos, so the stories of this secret war remained largely untold. In the TPT original production *Minnesota Remembers Vietnam: America's Secret War*, Hmong soldiers and their families bring to life the hardships faced during the war and in the brutal aftermath when they were hunted by the newly dominant communist government as they tried to escape.



"I find it remarkable that there was a war happening at the same time as the Vietnam War that has had such a profound impact on Minnesota and so few people know about it. Learning about the secret war in Laos – next door to Vietnam – and hearing from the Hmong soldiers and families about the raw truth of the lived experience has deepened my understanding of the sacrifices people make and the complexities involved in war."

# THE PEOPLE'S PROTECTORS

A TWIN CITIES PBS ORIGINAL | AIRS FALL 2018

With the highest per capita record of military service in the Vietnam War of any U.S. ethnic group, Native Americans served the country that historically had not served them. But why? Native Americans have a complicated relationship with the United States government: Their lands were stolen by colonists, resulting in mass genocide that led to forced relocation onto reservations. For more than a century, tribal lands and resources have been under siege as government-led policies were enacted to terminate Native American ways of life. Despite these invasions, broken treaties, and government negligence, Native Americans still valiantly honored their call to duty during the Vietnam War. To honor their service and bravery to our country, TPT is exploring the experiences of Minnesota Native American Vietnam veterans in *The People's Protectors*, premiering in fall 2018.


